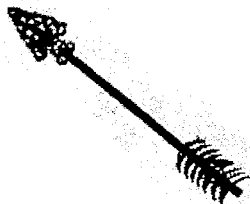

Once every year, the six Order of the Arrow Lodges in section C-1A come together for a conclave to share in fun, fellowship, skills, and training that can help your lodge.

The 2010 annual Section C-1A Conclave, hosted by Totanhan Nakaha Lodge of the Northern Star Council, will be the weekend of September 10-12 at the Phillippo Scout Reservation near Cannon Falls, Minnesota.

At a Section Conclave, you'll find many different activities and events to keep you busy from the moment you arrive on Friday evening until you depart on Sunday morning. At a Section Conclave there are limitless opportunities for Arrowmen to interact, learn, compete, and have a lot of fun.

Some of the Saturday activities will include training sessions in the morning that will enable youth and adults to bring a better program back to their home unit. NLATS

The National Leadership Seminar is a weekend conference on the skills and attributes of leadership. It is intended primarily to enhance the leadership skills of the Order of the Arrow's key youth and adult members as they seek to improve their services to the Boy Scouts of America and the greater community. The weekend format is designed to complement the longer, more detailed Wood Badge and Junior Leadership Training Programs. Near the end of the seminar, participants make a contract with themselves to apply the skills studied in the seminar on projects in their lodge, council, and community.

National Leadership Seminars run from Friday - 7:00 p.m. to Sunday - 12:30 p.m. They are held at different locations across the Central Region on a rotating basis. See the calendar for specific dates and locations.

Cost: Between \$180 for youth, \$190.00 for adults includes lodging for two nights, cracker barrels, meals from Saturday breakfast through Sunday lunch, seminar handouts, certificate, and seminar recognition(s). The Lodge will pay \$100 for any Arrowmen interested in attending.

The National Lodge Adviser Training Seminar (NLATS) is a weekend conference focusing on the skills and attributes of effective lodge advisers. It is intended primarily to enhance an adviser's knowledge of and connectivity with the OA's strategic plan, program and resources, while emphasizing personal skills that are essential to the development of effective youth leadership and ultimately the OA's service to the council.

The National Lodge Adviser Training Seminar (NLATS) is a brand new training program. The NLATS is limited to 40 participants. For this first seminar no more than two participants should register from any council. The course is designed for one-time participation. Repeat participation is not encouraged.
